Vincent Lenders (armasuisse Science and Technology) together with David Gugelmann, Fabian Gasser and Bernhard Ager (ETH Zurich) have received an award at the annual Digital Forensic Research Workshop conference (DFRWS EU 2015) in Dublin.

The paper entitled "Hviz: HTTP(S) Traffic Aggregation and Visualization for Network Forensics" was singled out for a prize last week in Dublin. This was based on work done as part of a research project that brought together armasuisse Science and Technology and the Zurich Information Security and Privacy Center (ZISC).

The researchers developed a novel method for the forensic analysis of network traffic data as a means of combating present-day threats in cyberspace.

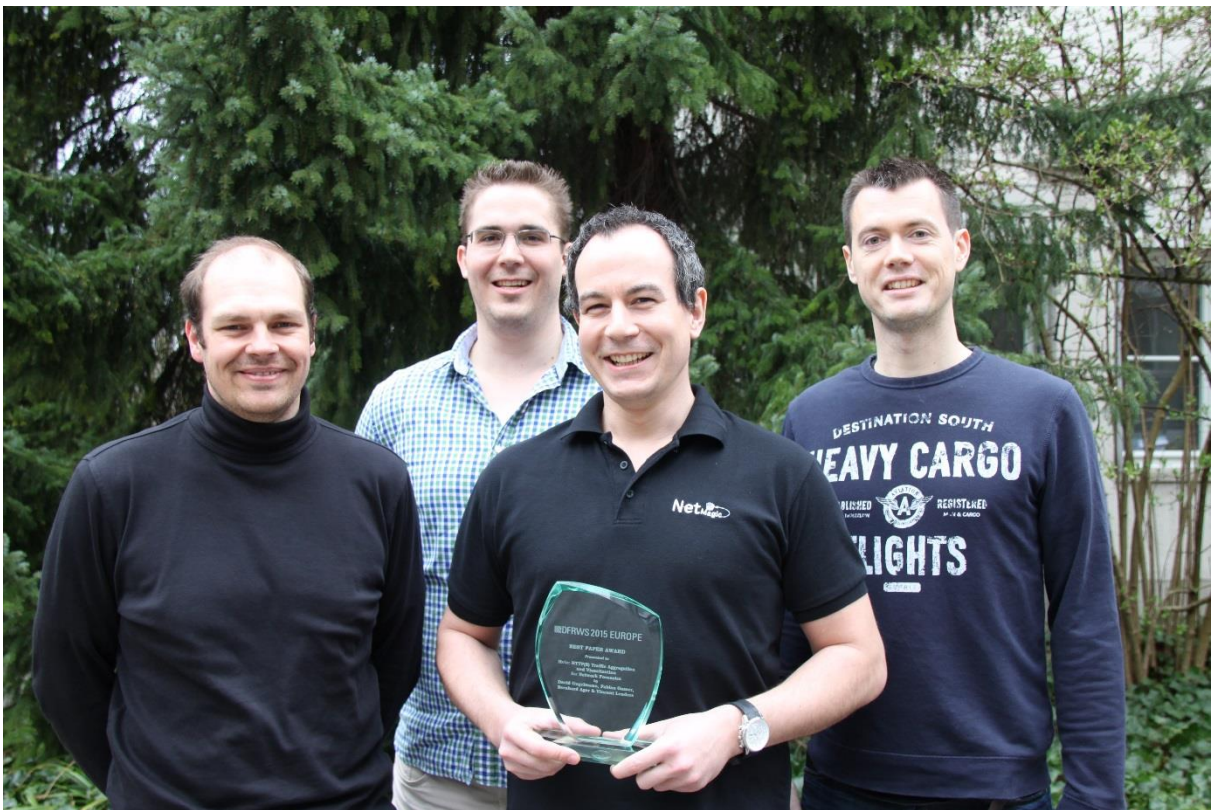
